

Using alternative home technologies to view remote learning materials & lessons during lockdown

These technologies may support pupils who do not have access to a computer or laptop to access remote learning. None of them is ideal but they would offer an alternative if there is no other option. Interactivity is reduced on all options due to a lack of camera.

Using a recent model X Box – this is the most useful of the three options

1. Plug a keyboard into the Xbox USB slot
2. Go into my games and apps
3. Find Microsoft Edge and select
4. Type in Google.com and log in to your google account as you would in school
5. You can then access your work and use key packages such as:
 - Word
 - Teams
 - Excel
 - PowerPoint
6. Use the X Box control to move around
7. Has a microphone to allow communication

Using a SMART TV

1. Access the internet
2. Use the remote control to type
3. Type in Google.com and log in to your google account as you would in school.
4. You can then access your work and use key packages such as:
 - Word
 - Teams
 - Excel
 - PowerPoint
5. It is also possible to stream your mobile phone to your TV

Using a Play Station

1. Identify the Play Station internet browser icon - it is WWW with dots around it
2. Press the PS4 logo on the controller
3. Go to the library and find options for games and applications
4. Go into applications and find the internet browser
6. Type in Google.com and log in to your google account as you would in school.
7. You can then access your work and use key packages such as:
 - Word
 - Teams
 - Excel
 - PowerPoint
8. Use the joystick or controller to move around
9. Has a microphone to allow communication
