KEY GRAMMAR FACTS

Prepositions tell us where or when something is in relation to something else.

Accents on French words are important and can change the meaning of the word, not just the pronunciation:
ou means **or** but **où** means **where**.

Online dictionaries are great but don't use the first word you are given :

- 1) Think about whether you are using a non, verb, adjective and look for the word class abbreviations to see which you need.
- 2) Remember we have many homonyms in English – check the meanings of the suggestions you are given for nouns to pick the correct one.
