# **EYFS Recommendation**

A poetic text that describes all the wonders of water using an imaginative array of adjectives and verbs – 'salty, surging and mysterious', 'Sometimes you roar and pour'. At the end of the book there are appendices with scientific facts about water forms and the water cycle.



# **KS1 Recommendation**

This book is about environmental impact of plastic and what the children can do to help. The author begins by inviting the reader to look at how many things around them are made of plastic. He goes on to show the effect it is having on the wildlife in the planet's oceans. The book ends by describing ways plastic can be reused and recycled.

# **KS2 Recommendation**

This books follows a group of Year 6 children as they venture out on their end of term residential trip but find that the staff, the venue and even their teachers aren't quite what they seem! Follow Lance, Big Mak, Ade, Chets and Katja as they learn more about each other and work as a team to take on an unlikely enemy.
