WIMBLEDON CHASE PRIMARY SCHOOL - PARENTS' SURVEY 2022 RESULTS

The Governing Body is very grateful to all those parents who took the time to complete the Parents' Survey Questionnaire. **There were 68 responses this year.** The responses were fairly even across the year groups from Nursery to Year 6. We acknowledge that the response rate may mean that percentage results may not reflect the views of all parents, however, they are a useful guide to both Governors and staff, whilst we continue to consider ways that we may increase response rates for future surveys and your support in this will be invaluable. As you may be aware, Mr Ellis made reference to the results in his Newsletter dated 1 July 2022 and noted that there were a few common themes regarding areas for development.

The summary of the answers to the OFSTED-style questions is attached to this letter. We have set out our observations below based around the following topics: (1) Well-being; (2) Teaching; (3) Communication; (4) School Management; (5) Other Activities; and (6) School Community.

1. Wellbeing

- The overall picture on children's wellbeing was very positive.
- 97% of parents either agreed or strongly agreed that their child feels safe at the School.
- 94% of parents either agreed or strongly agreed that the School ensures that their child is well looked after.
- 84% of parents either agreed or strongly agreed that behavioural issues did not disrupt their child's lessons. 7% did not. Although the nature of the question does not allow a more in depth view of the reasons behind those who disagreed, behaviour is an area that is considered on an ongoing basis across all Governor discussions and committees.
- As to the question of whether the School deals with any cases of bullying effectively, 62% of parents either agreed or strongly agreed with this question. 26% of parents did not know. That may be because they have not encountered it, but it may also indicate a need for further clarity on this issue. This was discussed in the Whole School

and Community committee and will be picked up for further exploration in the new academic year.

2. Teaching

- Overall, the results were very positive with 90% of parents either agreeing or strongly agreeing that their child was making good progress at the School.
- 87% of parents either agreed or strongly agreed that their child is taught well at the School.
- 21% of parents felt that the School isn't helping parents to support their child's learning at home and 25% felt that the homework set by the School did not help their child to consolidate their learning.
- Areas of development suggested were:
 - o to review homework provision (the comments requested both more and less homework) and to revert to parents with the resulting rationale
 - o more frequent and/or in-person teacher feedback, where possible
 - o consideration of how the School can further help parents in understanding how to better support children's learning at home and children's active participation in this area of development will be explored in the new academic year.

3. Communication

- 90% of respondents felt that the School communicates general information effectively and 74% felt that the School keeps them well informed about their children's progress.
- The School is always seeking to improve communications with parents. An area for improvement has been the recent replacement of the SIMS Parent App with a new alternative provider, to be effective from September 2022.

4. School Management

- With regard to the School's responsiveness, 79% either agreed or strongly agreed that the School responds well to the parent's concerns. This is a higher proportion of parents than in the last parents' survey (increased from 55%).
- 84% of parents either agreed or strongly agreed that teachers understand their child's particular needs. This point is equally relevant to the topic of the teaching provision within the School.

5. Other Activities

- 76% of parents either agreed or strongly agreed that they were happy with the range of extra-curricular activities offered at the School.
- This is an area for continued focus as the School will explore opportunities to increase
 the breadth of provision back to pre-pandemic levels. Suggestions were also made
 in relation to reviewing the music provision and, particularly the sports provision for
 girls.

• A review will also take place to consider how the School may continue to support club providers to provide ongoing opportunities and equal access to all children.

6. School Community

- It is evident that there is a strong sense of community and pride at Wimbledon Chase.
- 90% of parents: would recommend the School to other parents; felt that Wimbledon Chase is an inclusive school; and confirmed that their child feels like they belong to the Wimbledon Chase community.
- The School actively celebrates its strong diversity and continues to focus on inclusion as a fundamental part of our ethos.

Thank you very much for all your useful and constructive written responses. The senior leadership team, together with the Governors, will continue to discuss and review your feedback and revert on the resulting areas of potential development.
