attend a number of author events hosted by Wimbledon BookFest on Wimbledon Common. Children from years 4 and 5 listened to Sir Lenny Henry talk about his first children's book *The Boy With Wings*, a group of year 3s saw the iconic Dame Jacqueline Wilson discuss her reimagining of *The Magical Faraway Tree*, year 6 were entertained by Ross MacKenzie introducing his latest middle grade novel *The Colour of Hope* and a group of year 5 and 6 were inspired by Elle McNicholl – who closed the event – by exploring the representation of neurodivergent characters in children's books and in particular through her story, *Like a Charm*.
