

TRANSITION TO SECONDARY SCHOOL

Last year our Rights Respecting Ambassadors worked with children across the school to develop a Playground Charter based on our Cornerstone aims which you may have seen displayed in our playground. These values represent how we behave at Wimbledon Chase and are now our Cornerstone Rules.

NEW TERM REMINDERS - Safeguarding & Site Safety

As a reminder and for the new families that have joined our community, here are our **site entrance and exit arrangements** so that the school is as safe as it can be for the children and community.

- The school gates, both at the Merton Hall Road entrance and the Chase Alley entrance are opened at 7.55am and then locked at 9.00am. The afternoon times gates open at 3.00pm and close at 6.30pm.
- Parents who use Breakfast Club, should park and then walk children down the driveway to the club (please no driving onto the school site).
- Children should arrive at school in time for the 8.45am bell. However, children should
 not be dropped off at school early and alone as the school cannot accept liability for
 their safety.
- All families should remember to only enter the school through the main office entrance and only via the Merton Hall Road entrance after 9.00am and before the gates open again at 3.00pm.

- At the end of the day families should leave the school premises in a timely fashion a bell is rung at 3.50pm to remind families to vacate the premises.
- Children are not allowed on the school play equipment before or after school as the
 equipment is for use only during the school day or for the after school club only.
 Younger children should stay with their parents whilst waiting for older siblings to come
 out of school.
- Children and adults should not ride bikes or scooters in the school grounds at any time.
- Now that the children are used to their new lining up positions, please can parents remain back from the class drop off points and at pick up.

Please remember that parents can choose for their children to have either a school dinner or a packed lunch (not a mixture of both). If you wish to change from packed lunch to school dinner (or the other way round) please give the office one week's notice. Thank you for your support in this.

CLUBS/SCHOOL UNIFORM

Some clubs will be starting up next week including the different sporting clubs (please check start dates on each providers fliers on the school website). On a child's club day children should bring their sports kit in a bag to school and get changed when they get to the club (unless it is their PE day) and wear their school uniform as normal during the day.



LOST PROPERTY



We would like to remind parents the importance of naming their children's uniform (including class if possible). Every year a lot of unnamed uniform items remain unclaimed. We are very conscious of the expense of purchasing a uniform and we make every effort to reunite items with their owners. Unclaimed items are reused or donated, if their condition allows, so

please do check if all uniform is named (including any bags and coats worn to school).

There will be a **lost property table** at the end of the school day, outside the office **on the last Friday of every month and the last day of each half-term**. Any uniform not claimed by the last day of the half-term will be reused, donated or disposed of. The dates for the lost property tables this term will be **29th September**, **20th October**, **24th November and 21st December**.

Parents and children will continue to be able to look for lost items, at any time, in the lost property box outside the dining hall.

Pre-loved Uniform Sale

Unfortunately we had to postpone the uniform sale after school today but we will be having regular opportunities for parents to purchase uniform as children suddenly grow! All staple preloved uniform items continue to be sold for the amazing price of £1 per item.

THINGS TO LOOK FORWARD TO



There are many things to look forward to this term - we have put some dates on the website here as well as on the Parent App. Keep your eye out for information on our Autumn Community Day in October as well as the different trips that the year groups are organising - the year group newsletters will be sent out to you next week.

Teachers will often ask for parent volunteers for help in class or on trips. Regular volunteers will need to have a police check (called a DBS) organised through the school. If you do become a regular volunteer then Mrs Broom in the School Office can give you the relevant information.

There are parent meetings for children with IESPs on Wednesday 11th October and Parent Consultation Meetings on Wednesday 18th and Thursday 19th October.

JEANS FOR GENES
