PERSONAL, SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Do not always need an adult to remind them of a rule

Show more confidence in new social situations

Help find solutions to conflicts
Begin to take turns with peers during
play, without adult support

Play with one or more children, extending and elaborating play ideas

New children to learn the skills of sharing and turn taking.

New children to o establish positive attachments to adults and peers in the Nursery

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

Start taking part in some group activities which they make up for themselves or in teams To participate in fine motor activities to strengthen muscles

Use one handed tools and equipment such as scissors

To continue to try and put coats on, do zips up and put shoes on and take off independently. Can maneuver space and obstacles while running

Jumps with two feet

Climbs with hand over hand and foot over hand patterns (A frame)

Can approximate where feet need to be for support

Can remove and reinstate lids from pens Pours from one container to another

COMMUNICATION, LANGUAGE AND LITERACY

To communicate using more words and take turns in conversations

To follow 2 step instructions and answer simple questions

To organise themselves in their play Sing a large repertoire of songs and know many nursery rhymes

More grammatical structures emerging but still lots of immature structures including overuse of -ed ending and plurals, e.g. breaked, mices

Topics: Nursery Rhymes & Around the World in 30 days

EXPRESSIVE ARTS & DESIGN

To take part in simple pretend play and construct 'small worlds' with open-ended construction kits
To play instruments with increasing control to express themselves
To explore different materials and textures freely
Explore colour and colour mixing
Use pre-made paints and are able to

name some colours
Explore different drawing tools - e.g.
pencils, felt tips, chalk, crayons, fingers
Copies basic actions and can repeat
some independently

Moves to music

MATHEMATICS

Fast recognition of up to 3 objects (subitising) To use mathematical language during their free play

Begin to recite numbers consistently to 5 To begin to use directional language 'up', 'down', 'across'.

To identify and name basic 2D shapes Understand the last number counted gives the total

Solve real world mathematical problems

To replicate and talk about an AB pattern. To begin to create more complex patterns

Understand positions through words alone

To understand position: 'in', 'on', 'under'

UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD

Use all their senses in hands-on exploration of natural materials. Talk about what they see using a wide vocabulary.

Continue developing positive attitudes about the differences between people.

Explore how things work
Explore collections of materials with similar and different properties.
Talk about the differences between materials and changes they notice.

Know that there are different countries in the world and talk about the differences they have

experienced or seen in photos.
