ABCDE of Your Rights

A. UNIVERSAL Rights are for **ALL** children.

B. INHERENT Rights are there at **BIRTH**.

C. INALIENABLE Rights **CANNOT** be taken away.

D. UNCONDITIONAL Rights **DO NOT** have to be earned.

E. INDIVISIBLE All rights are **EQUALLY** important.

The ABCDE of Rights

- Rights are for **ALL** children
- universal

B: RIGHTS ARE THERE AT BIRTH

- Key idea: Humans are born with rights.
- Key word: Inherent

Rights such as the right to safety, health, shelter, nutritious food, clean water, which all humans have when they are born.

D: RIGHTS DO NOT HAVE TO BE EARNT????? What does this mean?



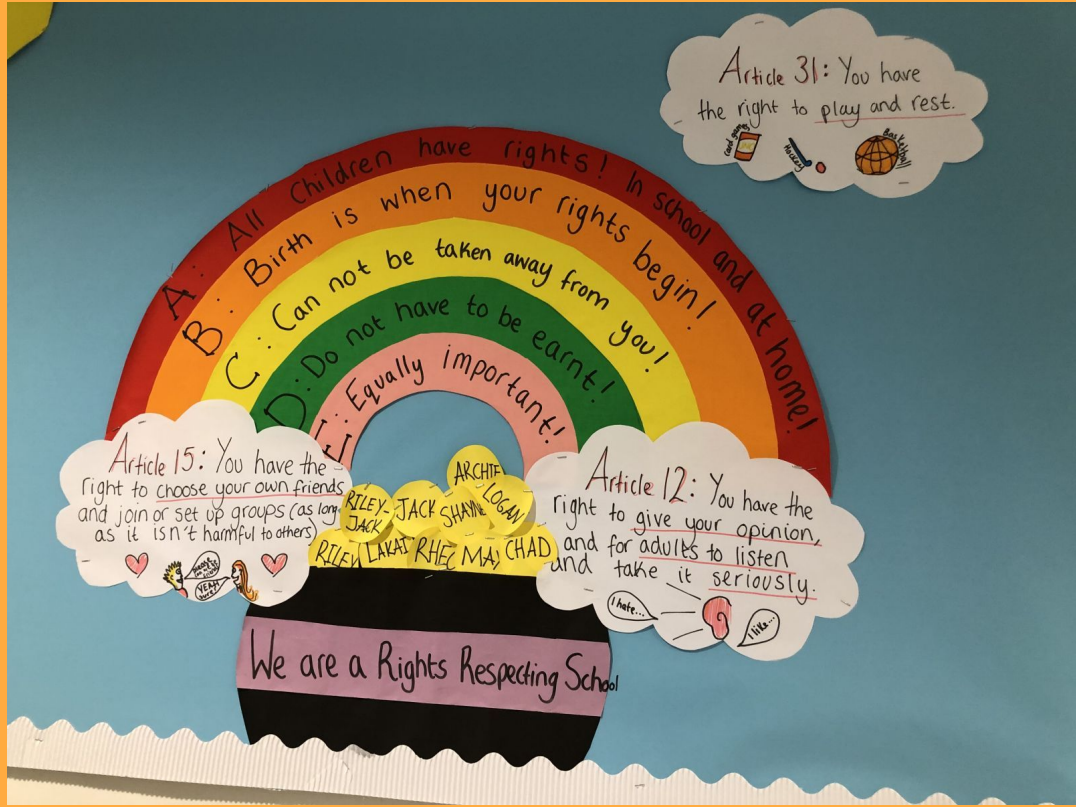
- Key idea: Rights do not come with any conditions attached and are not linked to responsibilities as they are not earnt.
- Key word: Unconditional

E: ALL RIGHTS ARE EQUALLY IMPORTANT

Key idea: Every right is important in order for children and young people to survive, develop and reach their full potential. Rights are a whole package and are interlinked.

Key word: Indivisible





Article 31: You have the right to play and rest.

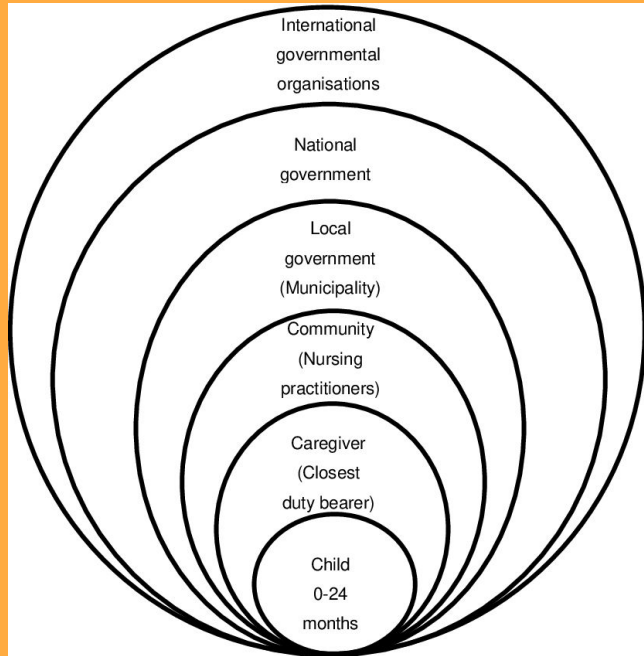
