- No displays/posters on windows that block light entering and therefore require lights to be turned on.
- No blinds or curtains closed during the daytime (if you need to close them to view the interactive White Board, open them straight away afterwards).
- Blinds should be closed at the end of each day during winter months (this is to trap heat for the next day, rather than saving energy on lighting).







- Reduce radiator-use:

 1. No radiator blockages. Obstacles placed in front of radiators will
- Keep doors and windows closed where possible. Windows and internal doors should always remain closed when heating is on – if it is too warm, that means the heating should be turned down.

Light Switches:

- Green sticky dot on light switch means these are the lights needed to light the area.
- Amber sticky dot means that the lights may be needed, but not all the time, so they should be checked throughout the day
- Red sticky dot means that in normal circumstances these lights do not need to be used.


