Learning at School for this Half Term

Our topic this term is 'Amazing Animals'. As well as hatching butterflies in class, we are fortunate to have our own wildlife area in the back field which we will continue to explore with the children. To enthuse the children to learn more about minibeasts we have a visiting workshop where the children can handle some large and interesting creatures.



At the end of the Summer Term the children will have an exciting visit to Bocketts Farm. To celebrate the children's learning experiences at the end of this topic the children will perform a Creepy Crawly Concert for parents on **Wednesday 10 July** at 9:10 am followed by a Transition to Year 1 Parent Meeting with an opportunity for you to see the Year 1 classes.

Learning Opportunities for Summer 1

Physical Development

- Hold paper in position and use preferred hand for writing, using correct pencil grip. They are beginning to be able to write on lines and control letter size
- Shows increasing control over an object in pushing, patting, throwing, catching or kicking it
- Shows understanding of the need for safety when tackling new challenges, and considers and manages some risks
- Children can hop confidently and skip in time to music
- Children know about and can make healthy choices in relation to healthy eating and exercise. They can dress and undress independently, successfully managing fastening buttons

Communication, Language and Literacy

- Answers 'how' and 'why' questions about their experiences and in response to stories or events
- Use past, present and future forms accurately when talking about events that have happened or are to happen in the future
- They use a range of vocabulary in imaginative ways to add info, express ideas or explain or justify actions or events
- Begins to read words and simple sentences refer to the common exception words in the middle of the reading record.
- Uses vocabulary and forms of speech that are increasingly influenced by their experiences of books
- Enjoys an increasing range of books
- Writes own name and other things such as labels, captions
- Attempts to write short sentences in meaningful contexts
- Participate in discussion about what is read to them, taking turns and listening to what others say
- Explain clearly their understanding of what is read to them




Summer Term Homework

Reading

The children have made excellent progress with their phonics, reading and comprehension skills over the year. We have added some extra titles to your child's ebook account. To access your child's Big Cat ebooks, go to <u>Collins Ebooks</u>

Please continue to read with and to your child as regularly as possible. It would also be beneficial to continue to go over their previous phonics sounds and tricky words especially if your child is not secure with them. You can support your child further by encouraging writing for pleasure; such as making shopping lists, birthday cards or keeping a diary.

Each Friday instead of a phonics task we will be sending out a Maths activity via Tapestry. These will support the children's understanding of the concepts that they have been learning at school. Please record any written responses, markings, drawing or photographs of your children completing these activities on Tapestry.

Uniform
